Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ.

On Sunday, April 14th, Pastor Howard Abts and Pastor Cindy Ritter were installed as cointerim pastors at St. John's. They will work together in part-time roles to teach, preach, and guide us as we continue to work together to move St. John's forward through this time of transition. On the same weekend, St. John's hosted a Build-a-Bed event to build 50 beds for children in need in Northwest Ohio and Southeast Michigan. 




