From Pastor Howard...

Sisters and brothers,

Remember this, from the September Voice?

- To come to terms with its past
- To encourage new leadership to emerge
- To reconsider its identity
- To improve its relationship with the wider Church
- To prepare to welcome its next called pastor

These are five things that it's very good for a congregation to do during a time of transition. Thanks to Sandy Orth's rebuilding of our website, some comments about the first of them are available here in the September VOICE:

This month, the second: "To encourage new leadership to emerge."

So, what's new leadership about, and why should we worry about it? Is there something wrong with the leadership we've got now?

Sometimes the leaders we've got now don't want to keep their roles indefinitely. They've been doing excellent work, and now they're ready to do something else. For instance, Jerri Reitzel would like to step away from coordinating our Food Pantry. She'll be offering a Temple Talk about it on November 17, and I urge you to come prepared to give her your careful attention.

Many of the leaders we have now are ready to continue, but with new insights, new ideas, new understandings. At the beginning of each meeting of the Congregation Council, the members discuss a chapter of a book they've been reading. One result is newness in existing leaders. Their reading and discussion are the opposite of their saying, "No need for anything new here. We know all we need to know!"

Another kind of new leadership has to do with the way leaders work together, the details of what they do. At our next congregational meeting, you will be asked to vote on a change in our Constitution. As it's written now, Council can adopt a Continuing Resolution by a ¾ vote, and not inform the congregation of its action. If the change that will be proposed is enacted, Council will still be able to adopt a Continuing Resolution in the same way, but will be required to make sure the members of the congregation are informed. Does that sound like a picky technicality? I don't think it is. A few years ago, a Continuing Resolution was adopted, most people in the church weren't aware of it, and that seems to have contributed to some serious misunderstandings. (cont'd. on pg. 3)

And what's leadership for, anyway? Isn't it to help us live as faithful disciples of Jesus? Well, we do that with each other, and we do it in the world. And we are changing. And our neighborhood is changing. And the world beyond our neighborhood is changing. Should our leadership still be as it was in 2009, say, or 1979, or 1929?

You know the Seven Last Words of the Church, right? "We never did it that way before!"

One possible answer is at Revelation 21.5: "And the one who was seated on the throne said, 'See, I am making all things new.' "

From the Council President...

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As we make our way through the autumn season, it is time to look ahead to 2025 and contemplate where God will be leading us in the new year. At St. John's, we will again see a change in our pastoral leadership structure next year. In order to spend more time with her dear family, Pastor Cindy has requested to reduce her hours for 2025 from half-time to one-quarter-time. In doing so, she will primarily focus on visitations while still preaching and leading the service one Sunday a month at St. John's. She will continue to closely coordinate with Pastor Howard and the church council to provide pastoral leadership and guidance in our ministry work.

In conjunction with this change, Pastor Howard has graciously agreed to reciprocally increase his hours from half-time to three-quarters-time for 2025. He will preach and lead the service three times per month and will also continue to provide his leadership and pastoral care in continued collaboration with Pastor Cindy and the church council. We thank both Pastor Cindy and Pastor Howard for their excellent service in working together to guide St. John's in Word and Service and to help us carry out God's work in our lives and community.

Continuing in these efforts, our transition team was formally installed in October and has begun meeting to review the work that it has been tasked with to help St. John's move forward and prepare for the pastoral call process. There is a great amount of work to be done, but this team is focused and prepared to work with the congregation through our next steps. We will continue to provide additional updates as the team's work progresses and prepares to directly engage the congregation for input. We ask that everyone in the congregation continue to pray for this team and our congregation, as we work to listen to one another, build up our congregation and community, and to seek God's guidance as we strive to carry out His work in our communities and with each other.




